

2011 EPAA batting cage policy

Junior League has exclusive rights to the batting cage **Monday-Friday and Saturday after 2 p.m.,**

If (Junior) league isn't using the cage, then other teams may use the cage.

Pre-Game Rules For the Cage

Note: The pre-game rules for the cage only apply if a Junior team isn't using the cage because Junior League has exclusive rights to the batting cage.

Although Junior teams should also follow pre-game rules for the cage when they have games.

One hour before your scheduled game the visiting team has the cage for 25 minutes.

Then, the home team will take the cage for the next 25 minutes.

Example: 6 p.m. game

The visiting team has the cage from 5 p.m. to 5:25 p.m. and the home team has the cage from 5:25 p.m. to 5:50 p.m.

From 6 p.m. till 7 p.m. whoever is in the cage has the cage, but must yield to the teams playing the 8 p.m. game at 7 p.m.

You can use this example for all game times.

When using the cage:

All of your players MUST be in the cage AT ALL TIMES!!!.

IF THEY ARE NOT BATTING, THEY SHOULD BE ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE NET!

No player should be on the field....this includes playing catch in the outfield, using the mound, throwing balls against the buildings, fences, or hanging out on the field.....EVERYONE SHOULD BE IN THE CAGE AT ALL TIMES IF THEY ARE NOT BATTING!!!!!!

Cover the machine when you are finished!

Unplug the machine when you are finished!

Pick up all the batting cages balls when you are finished!

No kids touching the machine!

No kids touching the machine! Yes we did repeat that.

No using the machine during your own games to correct a problem with a hitter during a game!

NO BIKES ON THE FIELD....PUT THEM IN THE BIKE RACK!

Teams (managers/coaches) who cannot control their players or follow the above guidelines will lose all batting cage privileges.
